



PRINCETON VETERINARY APPLICANT DATA 2016-2019

Compared to Princeton’s medical school applicants, the veterinary school applicants are a more diverse group in terms of their academic preparation and time to application. Thus, it is difficult to provide data that captures the applicant pool in aggregate.

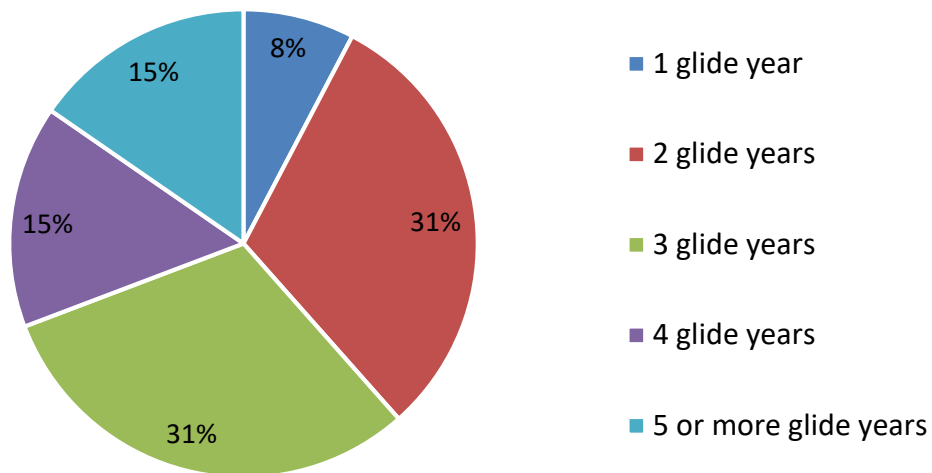
Academic Preparation

- Accepted applicants' GRE scores ranged widely but averaged in the 85th – 90th percentile in each section.
- The average total undergraduate GPA, including Princeton courses, summer courses, and postbac courses, was a 3.47, with a range from 2.6 to 3.9.
- The average science GPA, including Princeton courses, summer courses, and postbac courses, was a 3.48, with a range from 2.6 to 3.9.
- The average number of science credit hours was 81 (the equivalent of about 20 Princeton courses), with a range from 47 to 113.
- Of the 13 accepted applicants:
 - Nine took course work after graduation prior to applying
 - Eight were EEB majors
 - Two took summer courses away from Princeton
 - Three were career changers who took most or all of their prerequisites at another university

Application Timeline

- 13 out of 13 accepted applicants took glide years between graduation and matriculation at veterinary school.
- Most applicants submitted the VMCAS application in early September.
- The number of applications submitted ranged from two to twenty.
- The number of acceptances ranged from one to nine.
